The degree course in Humanistic Sciences combines the traditional contents of classical literary studies with the demands of modern society, paying particular attention to the aspects of Communication.

### OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE

The aim of the degree course in Humanistic Sciences is to give a solid, methodological and historical basis to the studies in language, philology and letters, without neglecting the historical, philosophical, geographical and artistic aspects which have all contributed (from Ancient times to present day) to building the essential features of our culture.

### OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMMES

#### **Culture and Traditions of the Classical World Syllabus**

Sufficient basic knowledge of the civilisations of the classical world.

#### **Artistic-Literary Culture Syllabus**

Knowledge of the Italian literary culture and literary communication.

Libraries, museums, organisers of cultural events linked to the classical world and the Christian culture, promoters of cultural tourism in places rich in archaeological and artistic interest, publishers. It is also possible to proceed to the specialist degrees.

Furthermore, with the help of a tutor, students can include the subjects they consider to be most useful for their university career in their syllabus.

The system of credit intervals adopted by the course makes it possible, in full respect of the minimum number of credits foreseen by the official table for Class 5 (Humanities), to create subject areas which, on the foundation of a solid humanistic culture common to all syllabuses, manage to effectively enhance specific skills.

For the **Culture and Traditions of the Classical World Syllabus** the emphasis is placed on the subjects of Greek literature, Greek history, classical philology, Byzantine civilisation, classical archaeology, Christian and medieval archaeology.

In the **Artistic Literary Culture and Communication Syllabus** great importance is given to the subjects pertaining to the performing arts and sociology in cultural and communication processes.
